





Statistics = a growth trend @ your library

- + 14% increase in check outs 2008 to 2009; 66% since 2005
- + 66,641 library items were checked out = \$1,666,025 worth of resources taken home with you (average \$25 per item)
- + 28,440 various resources on your library shelves
- + 40,016 additional items used in the library and on-line
- + 3,656 of you are library cardholders representing about 38% of the township's population
- + 34,000 people came through library doors
- + 6,950 visits to our public computers & wireless
- + 27,309 visits to the library website
- + 304 programmes with 4,953 participants

- your Library won a Province of Ontario award! Lansdowne, Lyndhurst & Seeley's Bay library branches received the Ministry of Tourism and Culture's Accreditation Award for meeting or exceeding 120+ requirements for public library service.
- Lakes & Islands Times Past: an exciting digitization of historical resources project and partnership with TLTI & Rideau Lakes heritage/historical groups; 3,500+ images and records to be available on-line by July 2010; funded by the Ministry of Culture
- active participant in <u>Read To Every Kid Every Day</u>: family literacy initiative throughout L&G with all libraries and Every Kid in Our Communities agencies
- 2nd annual Escott Spring Thing community development event
- new free <u>in-library access to Ancestry.com</u> = an amazing genealogy search engine for avid family researchers
- * we continue to provide free public internet/computer lessons
- 4 big used book sales as fundraising efforts
