



Statistics = a growth trend @ your library

- + 70% increase in check outs since 2005;2% from 2009 to 2010
- + 67,040 library items were checked out = \$1,676,000 worth of resources taken home with you (average \$25 per item)
- + 28,910 various resources on your library shelves
- + 62,700 additional items used in the library and on-line
- + 3,954 of you are library cardholders representing about 41% of the township's population
- + 34,750 people came through library doors
- + 34,250 electronic visits to the library's website
- + 14,150 visits to our public computers & wireless
- + 328 programs with 4,527 participants
